ABOUT THE CAMPAIGN

Medical Society of the District of Columbia (MSDC) is leading a coalition of DC-based specialty medical societies to advocate to amend the DC Health Occupations Revisions General Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-545), proposed by the DC Committee on Health in November 2023.

This bill is a comprehensive rewrite of the law overseeing medical licensing and regulation in Washington, DC. Unfortunately, the bill as written would overhaul scope of practice, place allied health professionals in oversight positions of medical licensing, and remove the physician from the center of the care team.

1. The bill would allow independent practice to advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) in the District.
2. The bill would not distinguish between different APRN specialties.
3. The bill would remove physician oversight of many complex and potentially dangerous medical procedures.
4. The bill would not delineate any additional requirements for independent practice.
5. The bill would equate years of medical training with certificate programs and non-medical college degrees.
